

# A decade of fundraising nets £40k

**A DECADE of donations made by Stanwell charity Save Children in Pain (SCIP) to St Peter's Hospital, Chertsey, has topped £40,000.**

SCIP, run by Les and Sandy Street, raises money for equipment to treat premature babies and their latest gift of £5,139 has paid for vital equipment to detect jaundice in babies.

Senior sister Mona Lau said: "This is a wonderful gift. We appreciate the support we have received from SCIP over the years and we are very grateful."

SCIP has a small nucleus of volunteers who run regular fundraising events that are held in Stanwell village hall.

Sandy Street, who lives in Lyndsay Close, said: "We think our efforts are quite an achievement for a small organisation and we do appreciate all the generous support we have received from the local community.

"We hope to continue supporting the very special work of the maternity unit and the neonatal intensive care unit and have more fundraising planned."

The charity held a race night on Saturday September 15 and they have a quiz night planned for November 24.
